

















Our Sustainability Journey

Egg Farmers of Alberta continued the journey towards sustainability in 2015, with a special focus on stakeholder engagement. Guided by our four pillars — Healthy Birds, Healthy Eggs, Healthy Farms and Healthy Communities — EFA hosted a diverse mix of influencers and decision-makers from across the egg value-chain, at the Environmental Stewardship Workshop. It was an opportunity to share ideas and provide strategic insights about the past, present and future of sustainable egg production in Alberta.

Even though the stakeholder engagement session was focused on the topic of environmental stewardship, it was enlightening to witness participants ask questions and offer opinions about the trade-offs between environmental stewardship, hen housing, animal welfare, food safety, economics and other factors. It is reassuring to know that so many people care about where their eggs come from and how they were produced, and have a passion for the collaboration required to build a truly sustainable egg industry in Alberta and across Canada.

EFA was also honored to be named the recipient of Canadian Poultry's 2015 Sustainability Award! We were proud to be recognized for being the first commodity group in the Canadian poultry industry to adopt an on-farm environmental program, and the first to publish a corporate Sustainability Report. EFA strives to build off this momentum as we continue down the path of our sustainability journey.

Every registered egg farmer is annually audited on the Animal Care Program. In 2015, 5 new elements were introduced to the ACP, and 3rd party audits were introduced. EFA also provided egg farmers with training in Welfare Quality Assessment protocols, an outcome-based flock management tool developed in the Netherlands.

EFA continues to put an emphasis on environmental performance, farm safety, and encouraging new farmers to enter the industry. The Producer Environmental Egg Program (PEEP) is the Canadian egg industry's first on-farm environmental program, which helps Alberta egg farmers identify their impact on the environment, and facilitates the use of best practices.




2015 Highlight

Construction began on Canada's first Net-Zero egg barn, where progressive technology such as a Heat Recovery Ventilation unit, solar panels, LED lighting and in-floor heating will help balance energy outputs with energy inputs.

2015 Highlight farms have

transitioned away from incandescent lighting, reducing their environmental impact by 33,000 kg CO².

EFA and the province's egg farmers are active members of the communities we live and work in.
